About

Cat Guardians, Inc. was opened in 1988, by director Kathy Blackwell in a two-story white clapboard house near the corner of St. Charles and Westmore Rd. in Lombard, Illinois. So far, the shelter has helped over 2500 cats and kittens find loving families. Many of the cats and kittens have been saved from the streets, helped to overcome medical and/or socialization issues and given the time and space they need while waiting to be adopted. Cat Guardians also provides a permanent home for cats that have not been adopted (yet) due to age, medical conditions or socialization issues.



Cat Guardians does not employ euthanasia, except in extreme and rare circumstances in which medical conditions are such that prolonging life would be inhumane. Due to its no-kill policy, Cat Guardians is usually filled to its legal capacity of feline residents. Today, some 50 cats and a rotating population of kittens reside at the shelter. Most residents roam freely, having the ability to play, nap or hang-out in their favorite spots.

Some of the daily activities of the shelter are feeding the cats, cleaning the litter boxes and the shelter, administering medication, and petting and playing with the cats.

Cat Guardians is a 501(c)3 charity.
